
And thanks be to God for never leaving or forsaking us, for always giving us the strength, peace, and all we need to live for and serve Him.




Have You Ever




LIGHT

At age 8, Alice accepted Jesus as her Savior while attending a Nazarene Sunday School class. The Cross in Our Bodies

This is a pretty neat story and an interesting thing that few of us know. It's brief, so please read. (FROM A DOCTOR)

A couple of days ago I was running (I use that term very loosely) on my treadmill, watching a DVD sermon by Louie Giglio...And I was BLOWN AWAY! I want to share what I learned...

He (Louie) was talking about how inconceivably BIG our God is...How He spoke the universe into being.. How He breathes stars out of His mouth that are huge raging balls of fire...etc. etc. Then He went on to speak of how this star-breathing universe creating God ALSO knitted our human bodies together with amazing detail and wonder. At this point I am LOVING it (fascinating from a medical standpoint, you know.)...And I was remembering how I was constantly amazed during medical school as I learned more and more about God's handiwork. I remember so many times thinking...How can ANYONE deny that a Creator did all of this??? Louie went on to talk about how we can trust that God who created all this, also has the power to hold it all together when things seem to be falling apart...how our loving Creator is also our sustainer.

And then I lost my breath. And it wasn't because I was running on my treadmill, either!!

It was because he started talking about Laminin. Here is how Wikipedia describes them: "Laminins are a family of proteins that are an integral part of the structural scaffolding of basement membranes in almost every animal tissue. You see, Laminins are what hold us together...LITERALLY. They are cell adhesion molecules. They are what holds one cell of our bodies to the next cell. Without them, we would literally fall apart. And I knew all this already. But what I didn't know is what they LOOKED LIKE.

But now I do. And I have thought about it a thousand times since (already)..Here is what the structure of Laminin looks like. . AND THIS IS NOT a 'Christian portrayal' of it ... If you look up Laminin in any scientific/medical piece of literature, this is what you will see...

Now tell me that our God is not the coolest!!! Amazing. The glue that holds us together...ALL of us...is in the shape of the cross. Immediately Colossians 1:15-17 comes to mind. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. All things were created by Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him ALL things HOLD TOGETHER.

Call me crazy. I just think that is very, very, very cool. Thousands of years before the world knew anything about Laminin, Paul penned those words. And now we see that from a very LITERAL standpoint, we are held together ... One cell to another...BY the cross. You would never in a quadrillion years convince me that is anything other than the mark of a Creator who knew EXACTLY what Laminin 'glue' would look like long before Adam breathed his first breath!!

What I found when I googled Laminin!!! - A cross swinging. This is cool - had to pass it on. I think we could all use a miracle. I know I certainly can.

1/17/2014

What was the first liquid and food consumed on the moon? I presume that most of us were unaware of this story. I didn't know this, but it's awesome! 43 years ago--guess what happened? Many have not heard of this before...Communion on the Moon: July 20, 1969 (This is an excerpt from the article by Eric Metaxas.) Forty-three years ago- two human beings changed history by walking on the surface of the moon. But what happened before Buzz Aldrin and Neil Armstrong exited the Lunar Module is perhaps even more amazing, if only because so few people know about it. "I'm talking about the fact that Buzz Aldrin took communion on the surface of the moon. Some months after his return, he wrote about it in Guideposts magazine. And a few years ago I had the privilege of meeting him myself. I asked him about it in my book, EVERYTHING YOU ALWAYS WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT GOD (BUT WAS AFRAID TO ASK).

The background of the story is that Aldrin was an elder at his Presbyterian Church in Texas during this period in his life, and knowing that he would soon be doing something unprecedented in human history, he felt he should mark the occasion somehow, and he asked his minister to help him. And so the minister consecrated a communion wafer and a small vial of communion wine. And Buzz Aldrin took them with him out of the Earth's orbit and on to the surface of the moon.

He and Armstrong had only been on the lunar surface for a few minutes when Aldrin made the following public statement: "This is the LM pilot. I'd like to take this opportunity to ask every person listening in, whoever and wherever they may be, to pause for a moment and contemplate the events of the past few hours and to give thanks in his or her own way." Then ended radio communication and there, on the silent surface of the moon, 250,000 miles from home, he read a verse from the Gospel of John, and he took communion. Here is his own account of what happened.

"In the radio blackout, I opened the little plastic packages which contained the bread and the wine. I poured the wine into the chalice our church had given me. In the one-sixth gravity of the moon, the wine slowly curled and gracefully came up the side of the cup. Then I read the scripture, 'I am the vine, you are the branches. Whosoever abides in me will bring forth much fruit. Apart from me you can do nothing."

"I had intended to read my communion passage back to earth, but at the last minute (they) had requested that I not do this. NASA was already embroiled in a legal battle with Madelyn Murray O'Hare, the celebrated opponent of religion, over the Apollo 8 crew reading from Genesis while orbiting the moon at Christmas. I agreed reluctantly.

"I ate the tiny Host and swallowed the wine. I gave thanks for the intelligence and spirit that had brought two young pilots to the Sea of Tranquility. It was interesting for me to think that the very first liquid ever poured on the moon, and the very first food eaten there, were the communion elements."

And of course, it's interesting to think that some of the first words spoken on the moon were the words of Jesus Christ, who made the Earth and the moon - and Who, in the immortal works of Dante, is Himself the "Love that moves the sun and other stars."

How many of you knew this? Too bad this type news doesn't travel as fast as the bad does...share it if you've felt God's love.

3/26/15

Dear Family and Friends,

Please excuse the mass email, but wanted to update you and thank you so much for your prayers, love, cards and thoughts. I have never felt so supported and loved. There is no way to let you know how much that means to me!!

God has been so good in this turn of events in my life. I have felt His peace and love and have seen His caring demonstrated through each of you, again thank you from the bottom of my heart.

What began as a trip to the doctor February 18, for a nagging backache and abdominal pains (no big deal, though maybe some diverticulitis, appendicitis at worst) turned out to be a 10 cm mass that originated from the muscle of the uterus and has visited some of its neighboring organs. A hysterectomy was scheduled for March 12, but the pre-op chest x-ray showed that there are numerous nodules in my lungs so it was determined that the mass is malignant with metastasis to the lungs. Therefore surgery was cancelled, a biopsy done last Thurs to get the exact cell type of sarcoma and I saw the oncologist today. He gave us LOTS of info to digest and we'll go back next Thurs to get more info and make a decision as to treatment. The options are to do nothing, let the disease take its natural course or begin chemo with a clinical trial may be an option.

Please pray I will make the right decision and that God will continue to work out His plan for my life. I want to honor, praise and glorify Him with my whole being. My sister came up from GA when she heard the news and has been a tremendous help as has Jill and her family, and Les. Jill, Kathy and I made a quick trip to Destin, FL after the biopsy last Thurs, returning late last evening, to make the most of this time while I'm feeling decent. And what a wonderful gift from God was that time!! SO much quality time with Jill. I am truly blessed.

Please continue to pray, a miraculous healing would be marvelous!!

ALICE'S INITIAL REACTION TO CANCER

Soon after Alice's cancer diagnosis, Jill suggested Alice rub 5 drops of Young Living Frankincense essential oil blended with 1 teaspoon of olive oil on her back and on the front of her chest. Additionally, Alice inhaled Frankincense during the day. Alice was diagnosed with cancer and began a daily regimen of Frankincense essential oil and she continued to pray for a miraculous healing.

Mid-March, 2015, Alice, her only child, Jill, and her only sibling, Kathy, took a trip to Destin, Florida. The trio stayed at the Hampton Inn and ate at nice restaurants. Alice remembers sidewalk cafes along Rosemary Beach. The last day of their trip, Jill and Alice went to the Ocean Club for a special mother-daughter dinner. MISDIAGNOSIS AND REACTION

Alice was misdiagnosed initially, so two weeks were wasted and her oncologist was then on vacation for additional weeks.

As a young girl, Jill Pollert would play with Alida McKay. The two girls shared many years in childcare together. Now at a time of need, Alida's husband, Patrick Zweidler McKay, a pediatric oncologist in Houston, Texas, reached out to his colleagues. So, rather than waste

precious time, Alice and Kathy travelled to Houston to meet with oncologists. Alice returned to Indianapolis with a treatment plan.

4/4/15

Dear Friends and Family,

A little update. It seems things are hardly ever clear cut and simple. The pathology report from the biopsy came back with a cell type NOT what the doctor thought it was going to be! It is an adenocarcinoma rather than a leiomyoscarcoma.

Adenocarcinoma tumors do not respond to the healing process after surgery by growing as do the leimyoscarcomas, so perhaps I could have had the surgery after all, or at least started chemo 3 weeks ago. The oncologist I saw on March 26 & April 2 only treats sarcomas and of course the one I need to see now doesn't have an opening until April 16th! I feel like I've lost valuable time in fighting this disease. I know God is in control and there is some reason this happened. Rather than having 2 weeks of no progress, I've made an appointment at MD Anderson in Houston for a 2nd opinion. My sister will fly down with me on Wednesday, April 8 for the appointment on the 9th & we plan to return to Indy on the 14th.

I so much appreciate (& feel) your love, support and prayers!! Please pray for wisdom in making the right decisions, safety in traveling (planes on time on Wed. so keeping the appointment will not be a problem), for God to be glorified throughout it all and for a miracle healing if that is His will.

It is wonderful that we have Patrick and Alida Zweidler-McKay to be with. Patrick is a pediatric oncologist at MD Anderson so he has good insight as to what is going on.

Dear Friends and Family,

My plan was to have the lung biopsy today, fly home tomorrow and confer with the MD Anderson doctor by phone when all the tests were back and she had a treatment plan. Seems that was not God's plan & His plan is always the best. We were told that the risk of pneumothorax (lung collapsing) was 50% going into the procedure, but that 75% of those resolved with the 4 hour period of time you were in the recovery room. The other one in 8 hours would need a chest tube put in and no travel until the chest tube is out. You can guess which group I'm in - yes, my lung rebelled, collapsed, needed a chest tube before I even got my body off the CT scan table!! I obviously won't be flying home tomorrow. Good news is I will meet with the MD Anderson doctor here on Thursday in person rather than by way of phone after back in IN. I feel better about that. Please pray all the biopsy reports will be back (especially the one from today as that will be a quick turn around) & the doctor will have the right treatment options planned and that they will be able to be carried out in Indy. Thanks so much to each of you for your love, prayers and support.

Dear Friends and Family,

First chemo done as of May 1st, next one May 21st. My sister was here with me the 1st week after chemo and was a tremendous help!! All in all, life is good. Today has been an excellent day, appetite back (hurray!) Visits from friends, dinner with daughter and family. I have also started acupuncture, which I'm feeling pretty good about in spite of the fact that before this I thought having needles stuck in you was something to be avoided! I also saw an alternative doctor Wednesday who recommended homemade chicken broth 2 times a day. So I have lined up an organic free range non laying hen who is going to be sacrificed Monday. She would have escaped if she would just lay eggs. I'm grateful she'll be nourishing me and will thank her. Another praise, the pain I was having in my right leg that made it painful to walk is MUCH better - not using the cane now, perhaps a combination of acupuncture, prednisone and God's touch. The doctor had said it was from the tumor pressing on a nerve.

Thank you so much for your prayers. Yesterday went very well. My vein was very well behaved and cooperative (& the nurse had good aim and technique!). The deed was done with one poke and lasted the whole 6 hours. Giving the Taxel over 4 hours instead of 3 with additional Cortisone and Benedryl before the chemo started warded off another allergic reaction, so no itching and red palms this time - hurray.

I'll have a CT scan June 30 to see what is happening with the tumors. It would seem they are shrinking as the leg pain (caused the doctor thought by pressure from the tumor) is gone praise Him (God, not the doctor, ha). I hated using a cane and am so thankful to be able to walk pain free! Also the abdominal and back pain are now minimal, another good sign.

I have had excellent quality of life since chemo began. The new normal is different from the pre-cancer normal, but none the less much appreciated. And B & B (bed and book) time is a good thing. My friend Lynda suggests C & M (couch and movie) time as a good thing too. I might try that out tonight.

And also glad they didn't initially diagnose it as a fracture as Dr. Matei said the treatment would have been bed rest - that would have been REALLY hard to comply with (& very depressing).

The CT scan also showed the fractures are healing. I also started an IV bone building medication today, Zometa.

God knows the right time & that is when I want it to be. I found out last Thursday (the 16th) my counts were low after calling the contact IU nurse when you have questions (had also talked with her on the 9th). I told her I was now running a fever as well as not enjoying aching bones & body, being very tired and having frequent chills. She said I needed to go to the ER to get my WBC count done. I protested a little, after all this was supposed to be "vacation" at my sister's home in GA. I thought maybe I could convince her I was just dehydrated & a little more fluids and rest would fix what ailed me. But no, she came back with, "You need to go to the ER to see

what your white count is; if it is low, your body cannot fight an infection and you can have organ failure"! WELL, ALRIGHT ALREADY, Kathy and I high tailed it to the ER (glad we did). I was started on an antibiotic and had a number of tests done. Kathy, her family and some friends & I had planned to go to a play in town. We missed that but the ER provided its own drama with an apparent knockdown, drag out fight that landed a casualty in the room next to mine. Officers paraded the hall outside our rooms with handcuffs and stern looks, but Kathy & I behaved, were not cuffed (I had no energy to be rowdy), & left after a reasonable time of 2.5 hours.

2. Wisdom for Dr. Matei in making decisions on timing of chemo and other meds (started a new IV med for bones)

3. That all the tumors will continue shrinking & disappearing until there are none at all anywhere in my body! To God be the glory, praise & honor for His healing. ALICE'S DEMONSTRATION OF FAITH

Alice's personal journey with cancer began as a concern about a nagging backache and strange abdominal pains. Alice felt like something was biting her from the inside. On February 18, 2015, Alice had her first doctor appointment. One month after going to the doctor, a CAT scan revealed a 10 cm mass in her pelvis. Later Alice was told she had endometrial adenocarcinoma at stage 4 that had spread to her lungs and bones. With this diagnosis, Alice recalls having a remarkable peace and calm. Her hysterectomy was scheduled two days later. However, Alice's planned hysterectomy was cancelled.

At the time of Alice's diagnosis, Alice was going to the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Paul and Jill, to watch her youngest two grandchildren, Branson and Aidan. The morning Alice told Jill her diagnosis, Jill burst into tears and said, "Mom, I always knew I loved you, I just didn't know how much! I do not want this to happen to you!" Jill tried to go to work that day but she was too upset and returned home. Alice joined Paul and Jill's family, Grace, Olivia, PJ, Branson and Aidan for dinner several times each week.

From the onset of her cancer diagnosis, Alice prayed to make the right decision regarding her treatment so God would work out His plan for her life.

In the midst of Alice's chemo treatments, Jill and her youngest two children, Branson and Aidan, tragically lost their lives in a firey car crash when a semi-truck failed to stop in a construction zone. Now, Alice, a woman struggling to battle cancer, endured the death of her only child and youngest two grandchildren.

The memorial service was held at the home church of Jill and Paul. It was a large facility. When the sanctuary was filled, overflow rooms equipped with video monitors were opened so all in attendance could celebrate the lives of Jill, Branson and Aidan. Amazingly, Alice spoke before this crowd with a peace, a calm and strength that was amazing. Alice did not crumble but became a strong pillar for her personal family and the Christian family at large.

Dear Family & Friends,

The appointment with the oncologist, Dr. Matei today went very well. We're all sorry to see her move to Northwestern U; it's surely their gain, IU's loss.

A plus of the surgery is that the primary site was identified as uterine, and since this is known I may qualify for clinical trials down the road.

Dr. Moore (surgeon) described the mass as large orange, small grapefruit size. He must have included the entire uterine, ovarian, etc. group in this description of what he removed as Dr. Matei said the cancerous portion was ONE cm nodule!! Praise God, this tumor, when found in February was greater than TEN cm!! That's a phenomenal reduction!

Dr. Moore on October 15 was recommending radiation to the abdomen, Dr. Matei does not recommend that. We'll see what Dr. Moore is thinking when I see him in November and weigh the recommendations, pros and cons. My body got its 4th whack of IV Zometa today. I can feel my bones getting stronger already - ha.

Dr. Matei says I have done extremely well. I told her God is good; she had no comment, but I hope her heart heard that. I also told her she is good too, as she is. I don't think her comment that this kind of cancer comes back and she would be looking at 6 months to a year for that to happen is so good. But that is the medical expectation, not what will happen if God chooses otherwise. Again my desire is to serve and please and be faithful to Him in all circumstances. And wouldn't serving Him whole (minus a few missing parts ha) healthy and miraculously healed be fantastic!

I asked to see the CT scans of my lungs and God's healing there is so impressive!! Oh my, the first one does look like a snow storm, now so much clearer - SO thankful!! Another bit of good news today was that the tumor's aggressiveness was downgraded to a 2, had been a 3 on a scale of 1 - 3. I later learned downgrading the aggressiveness of the tumor was not

Friday, November 6, I saw the genetic doctors at the med center who will study my tumor to see if it has markers for which there might be a "targeted therapy" if needed in the future, although with God's healing, this could be information to file under "interesting, but not needed!" I'll go back November 20 to get the results of the testing.

I saw the surgeon, Dr. Moore yesterday and he again said he was very surprised at what he found during my surgery - a clean abdomen, no cancer in the abdominal cavity!!! Praise God for His answer to our prayers. What a great feeling to have the greatly shrunken tumor and all its close companions (uterus, ovaries, etc.) gone, off to a lab!! Dr. Moore earlier had suggested radiation to the abdomen to blast away any stray cancer cells and to zap the bone lesions too, but yesterday he was less sure that was the way to go, at least for now, but did suggest a consult with a radiologist-oncologist to get their opinion. I'll see them November 19th.

I saw the oncologist Dr. Matei October 29th and she didn't recommend any radiation at this time. Chemo and surgery are finished (& I'm doing very, very well!!) & just to be really sure there wasn't anything else I could do), I emailed Dr. Matei with that question. She emailed back that I was in remission (that's the first she ever mentioned that!! - music to my ears!!) & I should enjoy my time, enjoy the holidays and grow strong.

Hair update - is now about an inch long, curlier than ever, with guinea piglike swirls - ha. Thank goodness for wigs.

2/9/16 Dear Family and Friends,

I met with the oncologist yesterday & it was mostly good news - the only not so good news was the fact that the PET/CT scan showed a new growth in the lung, but the good news is that it is small (8mm) and the oncologist feels a targeting therapy, a monoclonal antibody called Avastin will be a good choice of drugs to try. I had the first infusion yesterday and will have 3 more (each 3 weeks apart). A PET scan after the 4 treatments will show if it's working. If it is, hurray, as Avastin has fewer bad side effects than the chemos that kill both good and bad cells. And I'll get to keep my hair! I've braved going without my wig now a few times even though my hair is very short and very curly. It's just long enough & slick enough to cause the wig to wiggle - ha; frequent adjustments are needed! So being almost back to having real attached - to - the - head hair is somewhat freeing.

I also had an infusion of the bone strengthening medication, Zometa yesterday. My memory has been refreshed that this is the drug that caused aching bones. But better aches than breaks!! I can put up with this little bit of discomfort to avoid broken bones.

My sister has arranged for more beach therapy!! We'll have some beach walking, sky watching, wave listening time at Myrtle Beach from March 13 - 18 with travel on the 12th and 19th. Appreciate your prayers for safe travels and restful, refreshing time.

Dear Family and Friends,

Last week was eventful with severe abdominal pain beginning Tuesday evening. I called the oncologist's office Wednesday AM and they suggested I go to the ER to get a CT scan to see what was happening, especially since the chemo I'm on (Avastin) can cause bowel perforations. The CT scan looked OK they said, maybe some diverticulitis - sounded good to me; I left with prescriptions for an antibiotic and pain med - began the antibiotic Thursday AM after getting the OK from the oncologist's office that would be a good thing. The pain and fever continued but grew progressively less until yesterday at which time I was totally fever free - yea! and pain almost gone too.

I had a PET/CT scan Monday and saw the oncologist today. As usual a mix of good and not so good news, but all manageable for the time being. Good and bad, the pain was probably from a small perforation from diverticulitis or very likely the Avastin, so no more Avastin. Good news is, small perforation is healing well. The Avastin wasn't doing what we had hoped for, which is the bad news part of the report. The new lung nodule that was teeny, 8 mm in January, was 7 mm last Wednesday on that CT scan in the Emergency Department and 1 cm Monday on the most recent CT scan. It's growing rapidly. The Monday report also mentioned multiple nodules in the lungs. The good news is that the scan reported the bones are stable, lesions that are there were unchanged, although I've been having more hip pain.

So the plan is to do no treatment for 3 weeks to give my colon a chance to rest and heal completely, although I will do another round of Zometa this Friday to encourage my bones to be strong, and see the doctor May 2, to most likely begin another type of chemo.

The CT scan yesterday went smoothly, although they don't use ports at the Methodist South Plaza so Portabella was disappointed (as was I as I had the area all numbed up & still had to be poked the old way - but it was a pretty skilled and painless tech so it was OK).

I picked up a copy of the report this morning on the way to the wellness doctor's visit and was surprised to read the uterus and adnexa (appendages of the uterus) were noted by the radiologist. Hmmm, that's not the miracle we were praying for. The uterus was removed and should still be gone!! I don't want it back! I went back to the CT center and asked about this and they are going to have the radiologist reread the scan and write an addendum. I'm really hoping it isn't a tumor he was seeing. I'd rather have a uterus than a tumor. The scan shows the lung tumors are growing so chemo will certainly be discussed next Wednesday when I see the oncologist.

The visit with the wellness doctor went well and he approves of all the usual and unusual "extras" I'm trying that can't hurt and hopefully will help. One of the newer things I'm trying is infra-red heat (heat lamp) since cancer cells supposedly don't like heat. While 'frying" my back (bare from the waist up) with the heat lamp, the phone rang & there on my phone was the face of my good friend, Phyllis, from church! I'd never done "face time" before but figured that must be what this was so hurriedly tried to get my shirt back on. Interestingly, she was on her I-pad & had never done face time either and didn't really know she had called me. These high tech tools in the hands of senior citizens can be interesting!! I asked her at church if when she saw me on the phone if I had clothes on - ha. She's too kind to tell me if I didn't!

I see the radiologist Tuesday as a follow-up from radiation treatment last January and the oncologist Wednesday to plan the next plan of attack on these rascally cancer cells. My sister may come up to go with me.

The radiologist's report was also excellent - the 2 tumors he zapped are gone with no evidence of cancer & if they reappear, he'll zap them again!

The appointment with the oncologist yesterday also went well. The plan is to begin a chemo, Doxil, July 8, to hit the multiple, growing, bilateral lung tumors. I was concerned since a possible side effect of this drug is heart damage, but he was reassuring when he said he's only had one patient in his 10 years of oncology who has had problems. Let's pray I'm not his 2nd and that he's had lots of patients! I will have a stress ECHO tomorrow at 1:30 to be sure my heart is happy and healthy and to have as a baseline for future tests.

Dear Family and Friends,

The CT scan of December 30 was essentially good with no new cancer - praise Him! And isn't His timing amazing. I was due for the 2 types of chemo on January 3 but was not able to have the treatment due to a low red blood cell count. This gave me the following week off and was exactly the week I could join my sister and 2 friends at a time share in Panama City Beach. Kathy had told me about the time share several months ago but knowing how things would be that far ahead of time, I had no idea if I would be able to go. But God knew & gave me the chemo free time for "beach therapy". It was so wonderful - waves, beach, sky, good company (as well as some mighty fine seafood) were all so good - restful, refreshing and healing. God is so good!

I developed some headaches above, behind & around my left eye around January 18 that were troubling as to what that might mean as well as painful. The doctor recommended Decadron to reduce brain swelling from the radiation in case that was the cause. A positive of the

steroid is an increase in energy (I was cleaning the bathroom at 1 am!) & an increased appetite which I need. So it was a good thing but didn't help the headaches a lot. Next was to treat it as a sinus infection which seems to be doing the trick.

I did have an MRI of the brain on Jan. 23, which was good - brain lesions have shrunk by 50%! Again, thank you Lord.

An interesting thing about wigs. You can't wear them in a MRI machine! We thought I was metal free before going into the MRI but the tech pretty quickly brought me out of the machine when it let her know something wasn't right. The wig has metal clips in it!! Who would have thought? She said she didn't know it was a wig which made me feel good.

I wasn't feeling good about my wig this morning - couldn't find the darn thing. Spent way too much time looking for it & found it under the bed when cleaning for dust bunnies. They're about the same color, dust bunnies and my wig - ha.

I have an appointment at 2 tomorrow for labs and chemo if labs are OK. Hopefully the medications they've given me to boost my counts are working. I'm feeling like they are as I've had more energy and am eating well.

There's been no change in the vision in my left eye - yet- God can still restore that if it is His will! If not, I'm grateful for a right eye that is carrying the load of seeing for me.

I'm finally off the Decadron (steroid drug) which is helping some of the puffiness go away so I'm looking a little less like Humpty Dumpty (puffy face, belly, feet & ankles & skinny and weak arms and legs & a little more human). Although there are some changes, such as my hair is growing back but with a new twist - in a male pattern baldness fashion (no hair in the middle, but hair on the sides - just call me Al! (The Albert Einstein, Pig Pen look was a little better.) If my blood counts are OK, I'll have chemo on May 16th & May 23rd. I had 2 units of blood May 3 as I was pretty anemic. I was expecting a real surge of energy which didn't quite happen, but better than I would have without the extra boost. I'm doing some PT to help regain strength, but maybe just being off the Decadron will be enough to let my muscles know regaining strength is a good thing & needs to happen soon.

Sometime during the 1st week of May I woke up with a sore, nasty looking wound on my left upper arm that I thought was a burn from sleeping with the electric blanket on. But my sister is wondering if it is a spider bite? I'll send a picture of it to anyone who wants to cast a vote on what it is - ha.

This has been a really busy 2 days with a MRI of my brain, CT scans of the chest, abdomen and pelvis yesterday and with seeing the radiologist oncologist and oncologist today to go over the results of the tests. Results were mostly good with the only problem found being 2 new tumors in the brain. The radiologist is a very upbeat, encouraging person who helped me feel a little better as we talked. He says the new tumors are small (4 mm & 5 mm in size) and we'll try a different chemo beginning Monday. It will be Monday - Friday for 3 weeks. I'll have another brain MRI in 2 months to see what's happening.

The tumors are in the occipital area (base of the head) that houses visual and balance functions which explains my periods of clumsiness and visual changes. So far I have vision in my right eye, blurry at times but I'm grateful for all the vision I have! I'm still adjusting to no vision in the left eye. It really is frightening to know how quickly our lives can change, but then again, reassuring to know that no matter what, we are safe holding Jesus's hand and trusting that His plan is being worked out as He is in control!! The trip to the oncology center today brought mixed news. The good news is that the MRI from yesterday showed some of the brain tumors were shrinking; the bad news is some were growing and there are new ones. I was very sad.

The plan is to increase the dose of the current chemo (the dose that had been lowered because it was wiping out my red and white cells) for 2 more cycles (a cycle consists of 5 straight days of chemo followed by 2 weeks off) then do another MRI to see what's happening.

On a positive note, wrinkles are back. Who would have thought wrinkles would be welcome, but when your face is all puffy like a basketball (the wrinkles disappear! ha) it's a treat to see wrinkles rather than puffiness! Also with the steroid being out of my system, I've regained much of the strength that I'd lost through the long term steroid treatment.

That the next MRI will show tumors shrinking with none growing and no new ones! That I can tolerate the higher dose of chemo with no bad effects (counts will stay normal,

or normal enough to do chemo)

Dear Family & Friends,

It's been an eventful month of new learning & adventures & I'm here to say thank you Lord for all your blessings and thanks to each of you for your prayers!

On March 2. I lost a lot of blood (GI origin), my hemoglobin dropped (to 4.5 (should be 11-14). I was hospitalized Mon & Tues of March 5 & 6 to get 3 units of blood so I could once again stand on my feet without feeling faint! Source of the bleeding wasn't identified, but it was identified that I have a very narrow stricture in the sigmoid colon (1`/8 to 1/4 diameter & about an inch longer). The doctor was saying no raw fruits or vegetables - WHAT (! I love raw fruits & veggies, so I've had a few & just chew them to pretty much liquid & spit out what doesn't cooperate (I'm not too pleasant to eat with - ha.) I'm so glad no one said I can't have ice cream!!

At this point my medical oncologist referred me to Hospice - WHAT - it was just a little (or lot) of blood! At least I have all the info now - hope to not need it for a long time.

I wrote a letter to my medical oncologist & radiation oncologist stating my concerns about stopping treatment & beginning hospice, especially since I'm feeling pretty well (naps, the prayers & love of family & friends are so important) as is God's watchful care, presence & love for us. So I had 4 weeks off chemo (instead of 2) & just finished another cycle of Topotecan.

My medical oncologist then referred me to IU for a few 2nd opinions with a GI oncologist, ophthalmology oncologist & a neuro oncologist.

The consultations at IU suggested the gamma knife (a type of radiation) may be helpful in treating 3 tumors in the brain. Community said they could do the same treatment but with a little different machine (SRS - all Greek to me). I then had to decide - IU or Community. The Physician Assistant at Community convinced me they would be best as they had already done the MRI, CT set up and made the horrible mouth guard & face mask for treatment, Tuesday April 10th at noon. They will treat 2 tumors on Tuesday and a 3rd one on Friday.

I'm grateful she'll be nourishing me and will thank her.

Another praise, the pain I was having in my right leg that made it painful to walk is MUCH better- not using the cane now, perhaps a combination of acupuncture, prednisone and God's touch. The doctor had said it was from the tumor pressing on a nerve.

Dear Family and Friends, The last month has had some ups and downs but mostly good things.

The tumor in my right lower lung was given 4 targeted radiation treatments along with a cycle of chemo - all went well & I feel so fortunate to basically feel well (the expected tiredness is treated with naps!) usually at 11 AM. I lie down on the couch to watch the gardening program & am sound asleep by 11:15, missing most of the programs - ha.

The biggest disappointment was learning on August 6 that I have been denied the drug I was really excited about, Herceptin, a drug that would boost immune function but not destroy good cells. I was told that further testing determined that the drug would not work for me. I was very sad!

My sister came from Georgia and spent a week which was great and I've had some wonderful and oh so very strengthening, encouraging and happy visits with friends and family! I am so

very blessed and thank you all so much for your prayers, many ways of caring, and hanging in there with me. I'm scheduled for a brain MRI August 20th. And we'll go from there.

August 28, 2018 Dear Family and Friends,

A little update from the visit with the oncologist this afternoon. I was concerned after I was denied the drug about which I was so hopeful & then got the call from the doctor's office that I didn't need to come in for labs on Monday of this week as they were stopping all chemo. The only reason I could think was that I had used all the available options & had done all medicine could do for me.

The meeting with the doctor was a little more reassuring. He said some of the brain and lung tumors have been growing, but slowly & he thought it would be worth a try (no guarantees of course) to try a high dose of Methotrexate. I'll have to be hospitalized for 3 days for this. (It sounds like they give you a very high dose and then the antidote immediately afterwards, hoping your kidneys aren't too upset at the assault they received!

I'm thankful and relieved that I can still try another drug, although God's medicine is the very best & I felt His love and healing Sunday as our Sunday School class laid hands & prayed for me.

I went to rehab where I regained strength and stamina but not enough that my sister wanted me to try it on my own. I am therefore in another facility longing to go home if that be possible to have some quality of life free from the prison of wheelchairs, restrictions, and rules that keep me from moving freely about. On the other hand, St. Francis Hospice House is lovely.

I covet your prayers for continued regaining of health and strength, contentment, a close awareness of God's love and care. And praise Him for His promises of never leaving us. Please pray for His purposes to be done in my life and for me to be ever faithful. I have been blessed in spite of now feeling sad, but He understands. Quality of time God has given me, wonderful friends who encourage me. For family who has helped me.

My life is in the hands of God's time table. And He has provided a few interesting steps along the way. He knows that the Hospice House is not my favorite place to be and has given me some interesting dreams. Two nights ago I dreamed I was leaping over baby beds. I could even feel my muscles twitching in my arms.

I am continuing to await God's timing with as much patience and trust as possible and long for the day of Heaven and grand reunion.

Once again I thank each of you for your continued support, love, and encouragement. Along this tumultuous four year journey the blessings have been real, God's presence close, and His love never ending.

Alice working in one of her flowerbeds wearing a favorite sweatshirt reading "F A I T H" with a child in the picture Did you ever wake up with an unusual thought? One morning in October, 2016, I woke up with the thought I was to write a book about Alice. How absurd I thought, I am not an author. As the day wore on, I thought, "Nothing ventured, nothing gained". So, I called Alice and told her I thought I was supposed to write a book about her. She agreed and we set a date and time. I went as prepared as I knew to be. I had a notebook and questions to interview her. After about 2 hours, I thought we had completed my information gathering task. But, as I was about to leave, Alice said, "I have some things that might be helpful with the book." At that she handed me a literal stack with her emails, drawings, everything you find in this book except the back cover and this particular section!

Since I was working at the time, this became my evening and week-end project. Not knowing who the e-mails had been directed, I set out to type word for word everything Alice had sent out as e-mails and included the illustrations she provided. Seven months later, we were close to our debut of the compilation. Alice and I reviewed the draft, changes were suggested and some misspellings were corrected. (Hard as I have tried, I know some misspelled words remain. So your forgiveness, is requested.) This is now the fourth draft and surely our merciful Lord will allow it to be the last draft.

This compilation began after witnessing the power of faith and a miraculous battle against an initial Stage 4 cancer diagnosis of an acquaintance. As months rolled along, as a cancer diagnosis was compounded by family tragedy, and years were added to the life of a faithful servant, a dear friendship evolved.

WHY? WHY was it a mission to share this story of one faithful woman......perhaps I will never all of the reasons. I do know that my Christian walk was impacted by Alice's example as I have personally watched and observed her over the past few years.

Ah, I was familiar with cancer prior to Alice's story. Both of our grandmothers passed due to cancer. Then, our 30 year old brother died with brain tumors, our 80 year old father, after battling for seven years, succumbed to non-Hodgkins lymphoma and our 89 year old mother passed with colon cancer. Their faith In Jesus as their Savior was witnessed by all of those who knew them. Each journey was different but each resulted in a peaceful passing and great witness.

Near the end of our father's life, I asked, "Daddy, how do you have such great faith?" It was the only question I remember asking my father and not receiving an answer. So, I continued to wonder, how had each of them passed with such faith and strong Christian witness? Then, I watched Alice and thought perhaps I could find the answer through a journey with her.

In my diligent typing I found a pattern of Alice waking each morning with thanks and praise to God for another day to be alive, asking for His will to be done through her and a pattern in her emails. She continued to share the current medical status, then specific prayer requests, then praises to God for what he had done and then thanks to her many prayer warriors. Her perpetual goal was to ensure God receive all praise and glory! Can you imagine my amazement to know that Alice had 80 – 100 people receiving her emails, praying for her and sharing in her life!

So, I watched Alice. Her smile and quiet demeanor reflected a peace of living out God's will for her life. She did not only face the gruesome battle of cancer, but faced a horrific tragedy claiming the life of her only child and her youngest two grandchildren! She just kept trusting, accepting God's will, battling through each phase of cancer treatment. Alice walked with God each day, from sun up to sun down, praying and praising Him in the midst of her struggles. SHE DISPLAYED KINDNESS, TRUST AND SHARED HER SWEET SMILE WITH THOSE AROUND HER! She enjoyed her beach therapy treatments and added humor to her emails sent to her family and many friends. This example of faith is not often seen.....in fact it is rare.

One of the things that piqued my curiosity was something Jill Buck told Alice to do soon after Alice's initial diagnosis. Jill was an optometrist. Jill told her mother to use Young Living frankincense (specific brand was stated) mixed with olive oil on her back and over her chest to combat the cancer. Amazement....a health care professional was referencing a biblical healing remedy! I was unaware anyone used frankincense today. In fact, I thought frankincense and myrrh were limited to Biblical times. We will never really know if it was Alice's faith alone or if the frankincense made a difference in the length of her time on earth following her diagnosis. But it causes one to wonder if the frankincense with great healing powers extended her life.

I have often wondered how I would react if the diagnosis of cancer becomes my personal battle. Although I know I believe in Jesus as my Savior, will I have the peace that passes all understanding and be an example of gratitude, great faith and acceptance of God's timing for my life? In compiling Alice's details it is apparent she spent each day with our Lord actively in her life. She greeted each morning with a praise to God that she had a new day to live on earth. She prayed throughout her days. She remained faithful in reading God's Word. She always had prayer requests but also praised God. She was focused on God and His goodness. She remained a faithful servant, willing to live her life on earth or to go to her heavenly home. In the midst of this she has many family members and friends who encouraged her and prayed for her needs.

And so the mystery of God's grace as evidenced in the lives of our grandmothers, brother, father and mother who battled cancer, came full circle in observing Alice. Walking with the Lord, hand in hand, day by day provides the individual the ability to willingly accept God's will for his or her life.

On May 23, 2018, the <u>In Touch Daily Readings for Devoted Living</u> concluded stating, "Knowing and trusting God through His Son, experiencing His presence, and living obediently are the elements needed to develop an unshakeable faith. Jesus Himself said that our work is to believe in Him (John 6:29). With the Holy Spirit's help, each of us can have unwavering faith.
