"Faithful Servants with Their Master's Bags"

In Matthew 25:14-30, the kingdom of heaven is compared to a master who <u>entrusts</u> his wealth—bags of gold or "talents"—to his servants.

- 1. God is the gracious **<u>owner</u>** of all things. It's "*His* wealth."
- 2. God is gracious to all His **<u>servants</u>**. It's His wealth *"entrusted"* to us.

The parable of the bags of gold draws us to a deeper understanding of God's gifts to us and our faithful <u>management</u> of them.

Stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes.

Simply put, God calls us to lives of **FAITH**.
