"En Route to Emmaus"

Luke 24:13

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus.

Luke 24:15

Jesus himself came up and walked along with them...

Think of those about whom it can already be said: "Suddenly Jesus met them" (Mt. 28:9).

Luke 24:16

...but they were kept from recognizing him.

Notice the "divine passive". God is the one who keeps these Christ-followers from recognizing Jesus until it's the right <u>time</u> and in the right <u>way</u>.

Luke 24:18

"Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?"

The irony is that Jesus is the only <u>visitor</u> who fully knows what has happened and the complete effect of his death and resurrection.

Luke 24:19

"What things?" he asked.

Jesus plays dumb. He wants to hear what these men will say about him.

As Jesus listens to their witness, what's clear that they do not yet understand?

Luke 24:27

And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

"God is his own interpreter. It is finally God who must make the meaning of the Scriptures plain to us, must open the text to us in its witness to the crucified and risen Christ."
