Stay Connected with His Forgiveness

When you're deeply <u>connected</u>, you will <u>hurt</u> more deeply.

- Have you ever been deeply hurt in a close, personal relationship?
- Have you ever experienced the healing that comes from giving and receiving forgiveness?

Some of the hardest words to speak in the English language: "I am <u>sorry</u>. Please <u>forgive me</u>."

The fifth petition of the Lord's Prayer, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," is a request for <u>God's help</u> to do what we cannot do alone.

Those who confess faith in Jesus for who He is will also confess to Jesus who they are—<u>sinners</u> in need of forgiveness; debtors in need of <u>debt relief</u>.

As a "debt," our sin against God and others is described is a failed obligation.

Romans 6:23

- What's the danger in not forgiving others, as God in Christ has forgiven you?
